**S215798**      **CHRISTIANI ON  
DISCIPLINE**

Recommended discipline imposed: disbarred

The court orders that TONI LORILEE CHRISTIANI, State Bar Number 202884, is disbarred from the practice of law in California and that her name is stricken from the roll of attorneys. TONI LORILEE CHRISTIANI must also comply with California Rules of Court, rule 9.20, and perform the acts specified in subdivisions (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 calendar days, respectively, after the effective date of this order.

Costs are awarded to the State Bar in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6086.10 and are enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

**S215801**      **CURREY ON DISCIPLINE**

Recommended discipline imposed

The court orders that SCOTT MONTGOMERY CURREY, State Bar Number 242320, is suspended from the practice of law in California for two years, execution of that period of suspension is stayed, and he is placed on probation for two years subject to the following conditions:

1. SCOTT MONTGOMERY CURREY is suspended from the practice of law for the first 30 days of probation;

2. SCOTT MONTGOMERY CURREY must comply with the other conditions of probation recommended by the Hearing Department of the State Bar Court in its Order Approving Stipulation filed on October 23, 2013; and

3. At the expiration of the period of probation, if SCOTT MONTGOMERY CURREY has complied with all conditions of probation, the two-year period of stayed suspension will be satisfied and that suspension will be terminated.

SCOTT MONTGOMERY CURREY must also take and pass the Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination within one year after the effective date of this order and provide

satisfactory proof of such passage to the State Bar's Office of Probation in Los Angeles within the same period. Failure to do so may result in suspension. (Cal. Rules of Court, rule 9.10(b).) Costs are awarded to the State Bar in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6086.10 and are enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

**S215803****DAY ON DISCIPLINE**

Recommended discipline imposed: disbarred

The court orders that KRISTIN LYNN DAY, State Bar Number 269679, is disbarred from the practice of law in California and that her name is stricken from the roll of attorneys.

KRISTIN LYNN DAY must make restitution to the following payees:

- (1) Marlene and Carlos Obando in the amount of \$2,078.50 plus 10 percent interest per year from June 16, 2011;
- (2) Celeste and John Olivarez in the amount of \$10,000.00 plus 10 percent interest per year from August 11, 2011;
- (3) Robert and Lynn Ervin in the amount of \$3,500.00 plus 10 percent interest per year from June 27, 2012;
- (4) Ronald Spataccino in the amount of \$5,000.00 plus 10 percent interest per year from September 21, 2011;
- (5) Carol and Steven Herr in the amount of \$5,000.00 plus 10 percent interest per year from May 15, 2011;
- (6) Debra Bernabe in the amount of \$5,000.00 plus 10 percent interest per year from July 31, 2011;
- (7) Nancy Perez in the amount of \$5,000.00 plus 10 percent interest per year from December 29, 2011; and
- (8) Angilberto Salazar in the amount of \$6,000.00 plus 10 percent interest per year from December 23, 2011.

Any restitution owed to the Client Security Fund is enforceable as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.5, subdivisions (c) and (d).

KRISTIN LYNN DAY must also comply with California Rules of Court, rule 9.20, and perform the acts specified in subdivisions (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 calendar days, respectively, after the effective date of this order.

Costs are awarded to the State Bar in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6086.10 and are enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

**S215804****FERIA ON DISCIPLINE**

Recommended discipline imposed: disbarred

The court orders that KENNETH PETER FERIA, State Bar Number 221685, is disbarred from the practice of law in California and that his name is stricken from the roll of attorneys.

KENNETH PETER FERIA must make restitution to Robert Fuentes in the amount of \$1,099 plus 10 percent interest per year from September 6, 2012. Any restitution owed to the Client Security Fund is enforceable as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.5, subdivisions (c) and (d).

KENNETH PETER FERIA must also comply with California Rules of Court, rule 9.20, and perform the acts specified in subdivisions (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 calendar days, respectively, after the effective date of this order.

Costs are awarded to the State Bar in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6086.10 and are enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

**S215805****HANAGAMI ON DISCIPLINE**

Recommended discipline imposed

The court orders that STEVEN SUSUMU HANAGAMI, State Bar Number 165093, is suspended from the practice of law in California for one year, execution of that period of suspension is stayed, and he is placed on probation for one year subject to the following conditions:

1. STEVEN SUSUMU HANAGAMI is suspended from the practice of law for the first 30 days of probation;
2. STEVEN SUSUMU HANAGAMI must comply with the other conditions of probation recommended by the Hearing Department of the State Bar Court in its Order Approving Stipulation filed on September 25, 2013; and
3. At the expiration of the period of probation, if STEVEN SUSUMU HANAGAMI has complied with all conditions of probation, the one-year period of stayed suspension will be satisfied and that suspension will be terminated.

STEVEN SUSUMU HANAGAMI must also take and pass the Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination within one year after the effective date of this order and provide satisfactory proof of such passage to the State Bar's Office of Probation in Los Angeles within the same period. Failure to do so may result in suspension. (Cal. Rules of Court, rule 9.10(b).)

Costs are awarded to the State Bar in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6086.10 and are enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment. One-third of the costs must be paid with his membership fees for each of the years 2015, 2016, and 2017. If STEVEN SUSUMU HANAGAMI fails to pay any installment as described above, or as may be modified by the State Bar Court, the remaining balance is due and payable immediately.

**S215807****HUBERT ON DISCIPLINE**

Recommended discipline imposed: disbarred

The court orders that JUDITH LASCH HUBERT, State Bar Number 93982, is disbarred from the practice of law in California and that her name is stricken from the roll of attorneys.

JUDITH LASCH HUBERT must also comply with California Rules of Court, rule 9.20, and perform the acts specified in subdivisions (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 calendar days, respectively, after the effective date of this order.

Costs are awarded to the State Bar in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6086.10 and are enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

**S215810****IRVING ON DISCIPLINE**

Recommended discipline imposed

The court orders that BARBARA EDELSTEIN IRVING, State Bar Number 108412, is suspended from the practice of law in California for two years, execution of that period of suspension is stayed, and she is placed on probation for two years subject to the following conditions:

1. BARBARA EDELSTEIN IRVING is suspended from the practice of law for the first 90 days of probation;
2. BARBARA EDELSTEIN IRVING must comply with the other conditions of probation recommended by the Hearing Department of the State Bar Court in its Order Approving Stipulation filed on November 22, 2013; and
3. At the expiration of the period of probation, if BARBARA EDELSTEIN IRVING has complied with all conditions of probation, the two-year period of stayed suspension will be satisfied and that suspension will be terminated.

BARBARA EDELSTEIN IRVING must also take and pass the Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination within one year after the effective date of this order and provide satisfactory proof of such passage to the State Bar's Office of Probation in Los Angeles within the same period. Failure to do so may result in suspension. (Cal. Rules of Court, rule 9.10(b).)

BARBARA EDELSTEIN IRVING must also comply with California Rules of Court, rule 9.20, and perform the acts specified in subdivisions (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 calendar days, respectively, after the effective date of this order. Failure to do so may result in disbarment or suspension.

Costs are awarded to the State Bar in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6086.10 and are enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment. One-third of the costs must be paid with his membership fees for each of the years 2015, 2016, and 2017. If BARBARA EDELSTEIN IRVING fails to pay any installment as described above, or as may be modified by the State Bar Court, the remaining balance is due and payable immediately.

**S215813****JELIN ON DISCIPLINE**

Recommended discipline imposed

The court orders that FREDERICK T. JELIN, State Bar Number 105786, is suspended from the practice of law in California for two years, execution of that period of suspension is stayed, and he is placed on probation for three years subject to the following conditions:

1. FREDERICK T. JELIN is suspended from the practice of law for the first 90 days of probation;
2. FREDERICK T. JELIN must comply with the other conditions of probation recommended by the Hearing Department of the State Bar Court in its Decision filed on November 4, 2013; and
3. At the expiration of the period of probation, if FREDERICK T. JELIN has complied with all conditions of probation, the two-year period of stayed suspension will be satisfied and that suspension will be terminated.

FREDERICK T. JELIN must also comply with California Rules of Court, rule 9.20, and perform the acts specified in subdivisions (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 calendar days, respectively, after the effective date of this order. Failure to do so may result in disbarment or suspension.

Costs are awarded to the State Bar in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6086.10 and are enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.
